Stewardship Weekend

This weekend is an exciting weekend for our parish family. We are calling this weekend "Stewardship Weekend." We will begin our reflection on our calling to serve God in serving others, in giving to God of the many gifts God has given to us. We think of our Stewardship in three different but interconnected ways: Time, Talent, and Treasure.

Time

I invite you to think about the gift of your time and how important it is to give that gift, at phone bills have to be paid. least in part, back to God. 


