That statue was missing the grill, the sign and symbol of St. Lawrence's martyrdom. I want to thank Matt Fraser who is a wonderful woodworker and longtime parishioner for making and installing the grill on the statue—it is now fully restored. Thank you, Matt!

We will be in the process of adding a few more light fixtures in the foyer and painting the foyer in the coming months. Thank you!



You know what are some of my favorite moments in Scripture? The little "Easter eggs" of Jesus' humanity, things like Jesus falling asleep, Jesus drawing in the sand, Jesus playing with kids. 
APRIL SHARED SUNDAY ST. JOSEPH'S HOUSE OF HOSPITALITY

They rely on donations to continue their work. Bag lunches are distributed every day, hot meals on Friday and Sunday, grocery bags with food 2 times a week. Pastoral Planning Task Force Update

On February 27, the staffs of our 7 parishes met to give feedback to the pastoral planning task force and our pastors/pastoral administrator on a draft recommendation to the Bishop of possible future clustering of parishes when the Bishop is no longer able to appoint the same number of pastoral leaders to our area. The pastoral planning task force discussed their feedback on March 5. Some of the comments that evening:

We need to keep communicating that the task force was started by the leaders, not the diocese, and its goal is that the Church's mission of Word, Worship, Community and Service continues in a vibrant way in our area under the constraints of demographics, financial resources, and priest availability.

We need to pay attention to what the staff members said was missing from the draft recommendation: evangelization, the work of the 7-parish committees, and finances. We have begun collaborating in evangelization through the evangelization team: preparing Advent and Lent flyers so people can participate in events across the 7 parishes and offering two Lent retreats.

How do we do both: attract people to the church and deal with the reality we have today?

Parishioners keep asking what a cluster is—they think clustering is the same as closing. A cluster is "two or more parishes with the same leader"—Holy Cross and Our Mother of Sorrows are clustered parishes that are successfully collaborating—both parishes remain open.

The task force will meet again on April 22 to address what was received from the parish staffs and regroup. It is most important that we provide a recommendation, or recommendations, that truly reflect the contributions, thoughts, and wisdom of all involved in this process.
