Over the last few weeks, you may have noticed that we introduced the ringing of the bells when the presider stretches out his hands over the gifts on the altar during the Eucharistic Prayer. There is a reason for this, of course. When the presider prays for God to send down the Holy Spirit to sanctify the gifts of bread and wine, that is called the "Epiclesis." It marks the beginning of the Consecration of the Elements of Bread and Wine into the Body and Blood, soul and divinity of our Lord Jesus Christ. The mystery of the consecration is given further solemnity at the ringing of the bells during the elevation of the host and chalice. Finally, the Sacrifice of Consecration is completed when the presider finishes his own communion by drinking from the chalice. That is why the bells are rung at that moment, signaling to you that it is time to prepare to come to the altar and receive Holy Communion.

I want to take a moment to thank all of our liturgical volunteers: the musicians, the readers, the Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, the ushers, the altar servers, the folks who help to decorate the church. I also want to encourage you – please volunteer for one of these ministries. We need you. The sign of a vibrant and alive parish is the strength of our volunteers!

Thanksgiving is coming soon. We will celebrate Mass at 8:30 a.m. on Thanksgiving Day. I would like to invite you to that Mass and to bring one food item from your table to that Mass that we will bless at that Mass.

Christmas will be here before you know it. We will celebrate Mass on Christmas Eve at 4 and 9 p.m. Christmas Day Masses are at 8 and 10 a.m. On Christmas Eve, the choir will offer a Concert of Carols beginning at 8:30 p.m.

Please note: our Parish Office hours are typically 9 a.m. to Noon, and 1 p.m. to 4 p.m. The lunch hour is from 12 noon to 1. The Parish Office is closed for national holidays and other days. Watch the bulletin for those notices. Please try to remember these hours when you are coming to the office. Our Office Manager, Wendy Speciale, is always gracious – but it's important for her to have a lunch hour!

In just a few weeks, we hope, we will be placing a new statue in the Main Entrance of the Church. A parishioner has graciously donated to us a new statue of Jesus the Good Shepherd. That statue will be placed where the current statue of St. Lawrence is, by the Vigil Candles. You will be able to light your candle to the Lord. The statue of St. Lawrence will come into the Church over by the choir/music area. The donor wishes to remain anonymous but gives us this statue for the intention that the Lord sends to us shepherds to guide us a church, for vocations to the Diocesan Priesthood. #### **Praying with the Pope**

Each month, the Pope has certain intentions for which we are invited to pray as part of his worldwide prayer network. In November, we are called to pray for the prevention of suicide.

#### For the prevention of suicide

Let us pray that those who are struggling with suicidal thoughts might find the support, care, and love they need in their community, and be open to the beauty of life.

#### **Calling Priests Father**

#### **Ouestion:**

Why do Catholics call priests Father?

#### Answer:

One of the common objections evangelical Christians have to Catholics is our practice of calling priests by the title Father. They will often cite a passage in Matthew's Gospel in which Jesus tells his followers: "Call no one on earth your father; you have but one Father in heaven" (23:19). It seems pretty straightforward, but when we put this verse in context, we see that Jesus is speaking out against religious leaders who had forgotten what their proper role was and who were bad examples through their own hypocrisy and elitist attitudes.

In other Gospels, we find Jesus himself using the title father for different characters, such as in the Parable of Lazarus and the Rich Man (Luke 16:19-31]) and the Parable of the Prodigal Son (Luke 15:11-32). If we put the verse from Matthew into the full scope of Jesus' teachings, he isn't saying that we can't use words like "father," "rabbi," or "master." Rather, he is telling us that we should be mindful of the full meaning of those titles and not to misuse them.

To call a priest "Father" is more than a sign of respect for the office of the priesthood. It goes all the way back to the way St. Paul understood his own work as a missionary and evangelizer. Paul wrote, "I am writing you in this way not to shame you but to admonish you as my beloved children ... It was I who begot you in Christ Jesus through my preaching of the Gospel. I beg you, then, be imitators of me. This is why I have sent you Timothy, my beloved and faithful son in the Lord" (1 Corinthians 4:14-17).

Yes, we have God alone as our heavenly Father, but there are also those here with us who nurture and nourish our faith through their teaching and care. This is why the title of Father has been applied to the church's pastors in different ways since the earliest days of the Church, including monks and nuns using the title "abbot" and "abbess" (from abba) for their spiritual leaders and Christians around the world recognizing the "Holy Father" or "pope" (from papa) as the head of the family that is the Church. The title Father is a reminder that priests have a special responsibility to care for, protect, feed, listen to, and nourish those who have been entrusted to them, all after the example of our Father in heaven who never ceases to give us what we truly need.
