As I write this column Sunday morning, May 4, I know that you will be reading it as early as Thursday May 8. Most of you will read this on Sunday, May 11. As I write, we have no pope. As you read, we may have our new pope. I pray that if we do, the Lord will bless him with courage, wisdom, strength, tenacity, and most of all—discipleship. May he always look out for the poor and rejected, the lost, the forsaken, the people whom others hate.

The month of May is traditionally dedicate to the Blessed Virgin Mary. Since we had baptisms last weekend, we weren't able to put the statue of our Blessed Mother in the sanctuary until this weekend where it will remain for the month of May.

Today, Sunday May 11 is Mother's Day. We wish a very special blessing upon all of our mothers, grandmothers, aunts, sisters, god mothers, and all women who bring forth life. How appropriate that we celebrate the Crowning the Statue of the Blessed Virgin Mary today at the 10 a.m. Mass.

Somethings to put on your calendar and look for. As we come to the end of the school year, our Run for the Young of St. Lawrence School, a school fundraiser will be happening soon. Look for the information in the bulletin. We're also going to plan for a parish campus clean up day. We'll let you know when the Saturday will be when our volunteers will walk around our campus and pick up the debris and detritus that accumulates over the winter and early Spring. We'll pick up branches and sticks, do some gardening, etc.

Please keep in mind the CMA. I would really want us to make our goal again! I know we can do it.

A note about funerals: please be flexible in the dates you request for your loved one's funeral. When a family zero ins on only one day before speaking with us it is not always possible for us to make that accommodation. Sometimes, another funeral is scheduled for that day. Or I am not available on that day and may not be able to find another priest to celebrate the Mass. By giving us a few days, three or four, we can work with the funeral director in scheduling the Mass. If you have people coming in from out of town, please ask them not to make travel arrangements until the funeral Mass is scheduled.

A note about the Anointing of the Sick: may I once again say to please contact me long before your loved one is near death. You need not wait until the last hours to call me. I may not be able to come. Further, the "Last Rites" are the Sacraments of Anointing of the Sick, Confession, and Holy Communion. If someone is unconscious, I can only anoint them. And please remember that we do not anoint after someone dies. We will pray for them and bless the body, but not anoint. Call me when someone is sick, hospitalized, etc.— don't wait. And if they've been anointed, they do not need the sacrament again. Once anointed, one is anointed. If it's been a long time, they can be anointed again. If it's been a few months, they have received the sacrament!

Lastly, we inverted the numbers for First Communion and Confirmation in last week's bulletin. There are 34 of our parishioners making Confirmation and 56 making First Holy Communion. Please keep them in your prayers.

With this letter, I am pleased to announce the weekend of May 17 and 18, 2025, the Fifth Sunday of Easter, as Diocesan Mission Sunday.

The mission given to the Church by Jesus Christ to share the Good News, must remain a deep concern for every Christian.
